

# Mt. Fuji Oniwa・Okuniwa・Ochudo TREKKING MAP

**Search for some of the little-known gardens around Mount Fuji**

**Narusawa**

For those coming by bus, board a bus bound for Fujisan Gogome from Kawaguchi-ko Station and disembark at the Okuniwa bus stop. (This stop is closed in winter)

**Okuniwa** Approximately 2,200m

Seeing the pigmy plants here that have withstood the ravages of volcanic rock and weather, it only makes sense that Okuniwa is referred to as "the goblins' playground."

In addition to walking routes reaching the top of Mount Fuji, there are other walking routes for casual hikers. One such route is the Oniwa, Okuniwa, and Ochudo route.

This spot, popular among those in the know, is close to the Fuji Subaru Line and easily accessed by both car and bus.

The word "niwa" in the name of these sites indicates that they resemble gardens -- a veritable pleasure garden here on earth, with a range of alpine plants in flower and Mount Fuji on view.

**Tenguiwa**

The image of a long-nosed goblin in the rocks. It seems the long-nosed goblins living around Mount Fuji have been here to play.



**Hakusan Rhododendron**  
The in full bloom is July



**Lingonberry**  
The in full bloom is September from June



**Caution!**  
Volcanic rocks and alpine plants are forbidden from being removed as souvenirs.



**Oniwa** Approximately 2,400m

At the edge of the tree line are small craters where miniature larch and rhododendron plants can be seen, truly making this seem like an inner garden in nature.

**Ochudo** Approximately 2,400m

Lovely rhododendron plants flower amidst the forest of larch and birch trees, greeting us with their blossoms. The Ochudo is also called the "Rhododendron Route." It links the Fujisan Gogome point with the Oniwa stop.
